Accommodations: IAWAH Lodge or Bush Lodge.

The rooms in IAWAH Lodge are furnished with bunk beds and there are centrally located, dormitory-style wash rooms with showers. The rooms in Bush Lodge are furnished with a combination of double beds and bunk beds. Each room has its own ensuite washroom with a shower. Bedding and towels are not provided.

Meals:

Approximately 10 minutes before each meal, a bell is rung to announce that it is time to make your way to the Dining Hall. All of the meals will be provided by our excellent cooks. Meals are served "family-style" with a volunteer from each table serving as the "hopper". The "hopper" brings the meal to the table and makes sure that the table always has what it needs.

Medical Care:

Guests are responsible for their own medical care. There is a pharmacy in nearby Westport if you need any supplies, but we would recommend that you bring Band-Aids, cough/cold/allergy remedy, Tylenol/Advil, and any prescription medication that you need.

How to Register:

Registration forms are available online at www.iawah.com or by calling the camp office at 613-273-5621. A \$100.00 deposit is required to confirm registration. Forms may be submitted by email, fax or postal mail.

Cost: \$160/adult, \$115/children and teens, no charge for 6 years and under. Family Max: \$500

Directions:

From Brockville, proceed north on Hwy 29 and then west along Hwy 42 to Westport. In Westport, turn left on Bedford St.

From Ottawa, travel west on Hwy 7 to Perth. Turn left on to Wilson Street, at Foster Street turn left, and then right on to Gore Street. Turn right onto County Rd 10 (Scotch Line) to Westport. In Westport, turn right on Bedford St.

From Westport, travel west on Bedford St (also known as Salem Rd) through town (becomes County Rd. 12) west to the flashing light at Fermoy.

From Hwy 401 west of Kingston or from Hwy 7 west of Sharbot Lake, travel to Godfrey on Hwy 38 and follow Westport Rd east to the flashing light at Fermoy.

At Fermoy (flashing light) turn north on Lee Rd. Travel 0.5 km and turn right on IAWAH Rd, and then follow the signs 3 km further to IAWAH.
